

AWARDS/RECOGNITION FOR ACHIEVEMENT

The Governing Board encourages excellence as a goal for all students and wishes to publicly recognize students for unique or exemplary achievements in the following areas:

1. academics
2. citizenship
3. attendance
4. extracurricular
5. community service activities

CCA will award certificates, plaques, ribbons, trophies or similar awards for achievement, including improvement in class work, citizenship, school, community, state, and national contests. Awards may include food items. Such awards may be purchased through instructional supply accounts allocated by the Governing Board.

If cash awards are utilized, care must be taken to insure that student's participation in collegiate sports or their eligibility for scholarships not be adversely affected.

Student awards may include verbal recognition, a letter, certificate, or Board resolution, a public ceremony, or a sum of money.

Award Requirements

1. Principal's Honor Roll and Honor Roll

Requirements

Principal's Honor Roll: This certificate will be awarded to any student achieving a 3.5-4.0 GPA calculated at the end of each reporting period. In addition to the GPA requirement, students may not receive a grade of "D" or "F" in any subject area nor an "N" or "U" in citizenship.

Honor Roll: This certificate will be awarded to any student achieving a 3.0-3.49 GPA calculated at the end of each reporting period. In addition to the GPA requirement, students may not receive a grade of "D" or "F" in any subject area nor an "N" or "U" in citizenship.

Award Requirements (Continued)**2. Perfect Attendance**

Requirements This certificate will be awarded to any student who:

1. is on time
2. attends every Enrichment class offered
3. is present the entire day

Absences and/or early dismissal will disqualify a student from receiving this award.

3. Principal's Writing Award

Requirements: To promote writing among our students, this certificate will be awarded by the Principal to any student that submits a piece of written work in the form of essays, short stories, poems, etc.

4. Student Achievement Award

Requirements: This award will be awarded at the end of each Enrichment Class session by the teacher to any student deserving recognition in areas such as: academics, self-improvement, class participation, etc.

5. Citizen of the Kingdom Award

Requirements: This award will be awarded at the end of each Enrichment Class session by the teacher to any student showing exemplary Christian conduct in as well as out of the classroom.

Nonschool Awards

The principal or designee shall approve or reject proposed trophies, prizes, or other awards from nonschool donors. The purpose of any such proposed award must be consistent with school goals, and criteria for making the award must be either under professional staff control or acceptable to the staff. Such awards shall be rejected when offered primarily to achieve personal or corporate gain and publicity.
